



NAMES POPPING UP IN BELGIAN EMBASSY SAGA

-Stinks of A love Web and Money Laundering

Interesting reports of a love triangle and inexplicable sources of funds are emerging around the reasons why the prestigious Belgian Bank, ING Bank decided to close all of the accounts of the Ghanaians Embassy in Belgium it operates.

According to insiders, the Ghanaian Ambassador to Belgium, Sena Siaw Boateng, had allegedly blown some €1.8 million to renovate an Embassy property which is valued at € 2 million. Also, she has reportedly spend in excess of € 700,000 to renovate the Ambassador's residence.

A more sizzling twist to the saga is that one Edwin Boateng, a nephew to President Akufo Addo, may be on the radar of intelligence network for a supposed inexplicable movement of funds.

Our sources say Mr. Boateng has a particularly interesting relationship with the Ambassador. Incidentally, the Ambassador is reportedly close to another powerful individual close to the President at the Presidency.

Details of this scandal are still sketchy and riddled with serious speculations.

The saga at the Ghanaians Mission in Belgium



reveals that the ING Bank suddenly pulled the plugs on the embassy and gave no reasons to the embarrassed diplomatic installation in Brussels.

The bank simply referred to Article 59 of General Regulations, which allows it to terminate business relationships with some of its clients without any recourse to any explanation.

Effectively, the Ghanaian Embassy was given until November 12, 2020, to withdraw all their funds from the four accounts that the mission operates at the bank.

"At the embassy, we received a letter out of the blue from our bankers

in August that they had decided to trigger an article. When you open an account with the bank you sign that agreement. That article states that both parties can abrogate the agreement without any justification or explanation. They asked us to remove our money and put it in another bank. That's how they put it," Ghana's Ambassador to Belgium, Sena Siaw Boateng, told reporters.

The situation leaves many unanswered questions as Whatsup News is gathering that following the Blacklisting of Ghana as a money-laundering hun by the European Union, international in-

telligence networks are closing in on suspicious movement of funds by appointees in the Akufo Addo administration.

The ING Bank is reputed for its high integrity internationally and would not want to associate with dirty money, even if it required stepping on diplomatic toes.

The Belgian situation is reportedly one of many more such blacklisting s set to hit Ghana in Europe and other countries.

Already, the government is exposed by a number of official deals that had been routed through notorious money-laundering hubs. For instance, the controversial Agyapa Royalty deal spearheaded by the Minister of Finance, Ken Ofori-Atta is domiciled in Jersey, the world's third-aggressive money-laundering hub.

The second such questionable deal is the COVID19 testing at the Kotota International Airport (KIA) by Frontier Health Services Limited, a company linked to several shell companies associated Panama and Dominica in the interest of fugitive Nigerian Billionaire, Dominic Peters.

Dominic Peters has been linked to high-level international bribes and crude oil theft under the auspices of the disgraced former Nigerian Oil Minister Diezani K. Alison-Madueke.



LYING URSULA OWUSU CAUGHT PANTS DOWN IN PRIVATE JET CAMPAIGN

In an attempt to extricate herself from allegations of having been taxied in a private jet on her campaign tour to the poverty-stricken northern part of the country, Communications Minister Ursula Gifty Owusu-Ekuful has unwittingly entangled herself by posting her boarding pass of Africa World Airline, claiming she never frolicked in a private jet on the trip.

"I didn't know Africa World Airline is now a private jet!!!" she rhetorically rebuffed reports made by Whatsup News on Monday October 5, 2020.

In a post on her

Facebook page, she narrated: "I flew to Tamale on 28th September, last week Monday, en route to the upper East Region for a campaign tour primarily to assist the female candidates in Navrongo and Bawku. Here is my boarding pass and I actually changed seats and sat in 4 D. Some people have developed a penchant for lying through their teeth." After which she posted a badly creased boarding pass.

What she, however, failed to admit was that the boarding pass she posted as evidence, was just for a one-way trip. It was from the

Kotoka International Airport to the Tamale Airport. Since she lives in Accra, a boarding pass for her return trip would have adequately cleared the allegations.

Indeed, Whatsup News has intercepted her flight manifest, showing that she did fly a private jet back to the Kotoka International Airport on October 3, 2020. It is believed her trip aboard the Africa World Airline (AWA) was a mere decoy to throw off prying eyes from the extravagant campaign.

The flight manifest seen by this publication contains her full biodata and that of the two

other people she travelled with. For instance, she travelled with One Nana Boatema Asare, a 41-year-old born on March 26, 1979 and a Pastor, 50-year-old Pastor called Olawole Olaiya Philips. The Pastor was born on August 27, 1961.

According to unconfirmed reports from sources, this was not the first time Mrs. Owusu-Ekuful had been frolicking in the mysterious private Jet which costs some US\$ 4 million to purchase.

The true owner of the aircraft is still unknown, as Whatsup News tracks the available leads.

So far, Investigations reveal that the owners of the private jet have carefully masked their identity, as enquiries are only returning blanks as to who really owns the luxury aircraft.

A probe by What-

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sup News of the flight history of the aircraft, however, shows some interesting perspectives. It is established that the aircraft only makes clandestine trips between Nigeria, Ghana and Burkina Faso.

around 11.40 am. By the evening of that day (around 4 pm) the aircraft took off and landed at KIA an hour later.

Later, on Thursday, October 1, 2020, the mysterious plane flew to the Murtala Mohammed International Airport in Ikeja-Lagos, Nigeria. It did not return,

"My 4 days working tour in the Upper East region saw me visiting the tomb of late Madam Hawa Yakubu in Pusiga to pay my respect to the woman who many referred to as 'Iron Lady,'" she

We tracked the movement of the aircraft-a Bombardier Challenger CL 604, with registration number T7-MJJ, through September 30, 2020 to October 3, 2020. Within this period, the aircraft had made seven (7) trips to the three above-mentioned countries.

Importantly, oOn September 30, 2020, the T7-MJJ took off around 10.30 am from the Kotoka International Airport and landed in Ouagadougou in Burkina Faso the same day,

preferring to remain in Nigeria till the dawn, around 3 am on Saturday, October 3, 2020.

The aircraft then primed itself briefly and by 5 am that same day (October 3, 2020), it was on its way to the Tamale Airport. It picked up its three passengers around 7.12 am and landed at KIA around 7.50 am.

Incidentally, that was the very day, Mrs. Ursula Owusu-Ekuful returned, because by 5.33 pm on Saturday, October 3, 2020, she took to Facebook, glee-

wrote.

Insiders tell Whatsup News that beyond the solemn tribute to the Late Hawa Yakubu, Owusu-Ekuful's trip was a hatchet job for the governing New Patriotic Party (NPP) which has set its sights on diluting the votes of the opposition National Democratic Congress (NDC) in the Garu, Pusiga and Tempene constituencies.

Whatsup News has also gathered from sources that Special Prosecutor, Martin A.B.K Amidu is also

Some are suggesting the private jet was purchased by a current government appointee, while others believe it is linked to the fugitive Nigerian Billionaire Benedict Peters, who has been given the contract to charge each inbound foreign traveller to Ghana a questionable US\$ 150 per COVID-19 Antigen test.



AIRPORT AUTHORITY TURNS TERMINAL 2 INTO COVID-19 QUARANTINE CENTRE

-Endangers Domestic Travellers

Whatsup News has gathered from sources at the Kotoka International Airport (KIA) that the Management of Ghana Airport Company Limited (GACL) has turned the domestic terminal at the airport (Terminal 2) into a Gestapo-styled holding centre for foreign travellers to Ghana who cannot pay the outrageous US\$ 150 for COVID-19 test.

Senior officers are reportedly worried that this measure is certain to expose Ghanaian domestic travellers to potential COVID-19 infections because the detained travellers virtually use the same facilities at Terminal 2 with otherwise healthy domestic travellers.

Whatsup News can report that foreign travellers into Ghana who cannot cough up the much-criticised COVID-19 test fees are detained for about 24 hours at the



main international terminal (Terminal 3) and later shipped to Terminal 2 for unknown days before they are reportedly forced into quarantine by the security agencies.

Responding to a viral video of disgruntled travellers showing their sorry state at the holding centres at the airport, the GACL admitted that recalcitrant travellers are indeed detained. It however, did not specifically state where.

“Management wishes to emphasise that the

guidelines for arriving passengers state that, passengers who refuse to pay for the COVID-19 test will be handed over to State Security Agencies and taken into quarantine at designated locations,” the GACL stated in a statement released on Monday, October 5, 2020.

Over the weekend, Whatsup News happened upon a disturbing video of distressed Ghanaians travellers who have been detained at KIA for being unable to

cough up the contentious US\$150.

The video which has gone viral shows a four-month-old baby forced to sleep on the bare benches at the arrival lounge of the airport after its parents could not pay the controversial amount to get them and their baby tested.

According to the amateur photographer who catalogued the predicament of these stranded

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
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travellers, they demanded airport authorities to quarantine them since they could not pay for the test, but officials reportedly told them that the government cannot pay for their quarantine and that they must remain at the airport indefinitely.

At the time of the video, the passengers claim they were on the verge of spending two days sleeping on the airport benches instead of reuniting with their family and friends they journeyed to visit.

The Akufo Addo administration has been accused of unduly using a COVID-19 excuse to exploit international travellers to Ghana, by requiring them to squeeze out some US\$ 150 each for a cheap COVID-19 Antigen test, the third-highest fee in the world.

Investigations have revealed that the company responsible for the test, Frontier Health Services Limited is owned by Nigerian fugitive Billionaire friend of the Jubilee House, Benedict Peters,

The circumstances around the award of the contract to slap US\$ 150 on each COVID test has mostly remained hushed up as a cross-section of



Ghanaian parliamentarians demand answers.

The deal also makes it obvious that the company dispensing the test, Frontier Health Services is bearing no risk whatsoever, yet, it takes the lion's share of the booty from the test on arriving passengers. Frontier keeps approximately US\$ 139, while three major government institutions at the frontline of the COVID-19 fight get to keep a paltry US\$ 11 per test.

The three include the Noguchi Memorial Medical Research Institute, US\$4; the Ghana Health

Services, US\$3 and the GACL, US\$ 4 per test.

Serious questions around the test have popped up, as it turned out that Frontier may be repatriating the funds out of the country to notorious tax havens in Dominica and Panama, where its owners have set up shell companies.

Frontier Health Services is owned 100% by Healthcare Solutions Limited, a company which is, in turn, owned 100% by The Peters Family Company Limited, an opaque company registered in the notorious Caribbean Island tax haven called

Dominica.

Curiously, Professor William Kwabena Ampofo, the point man at the Noguchi Memorial Institute for Medical Research (NMIMR) who facilitated the entire deal, is a cousin to President Akufo Addo.

Professor Ampofo is the Coordinator of the National Laboratory for COVID 19 Testing at Noguchi. He clandestinely handed over the authorisation for the COVID-19 test to Frontier Services.

The true owners of the companies, aside the Nigerian Billionaire are still unknown. Checks indicate that the stated Capital of Healthcare Solutions is a mere one dollar (US\$1). It is unclear how such a company with virtually no track record in such infectious disease control system clinch the deal at the Kotoka airport.

So far, civil society groups such as IMANI Africa have been asking probing questions and they have warned that the test has not even been subjected to mandatory standardisation protocols as required by Ghanaian laws. Essentially, the test may well be a scam due to the fact of its secret endorsement and also the fact that it is an antigen test of a mere 50% accuracy rate.



RULING PARTY CAPOS MOUNT SUBTLE PRESSURE ON AMIDU TO SCUTTLE AGYAPA PROBE



Dr Mark Assibey-Yeboah, Chairman for the finance committee of Parliament has started mounting subtle pressure to influence the Special Prosecutor, Martin Amidu who claims he is launching a probe into the scandalous Agyapa Royalties Limited deal.

According to him, he would be surprised if Martin Amidu discovers anything wrong in the entire Agyapa deal.

In what appears to be a nuanced attempt to preempt the outcome of the SPO's investigations, Assibey Yeboah said he is confident the Special Prosecutor would not discover anything significant against the deal.

Assibey Yeboah is the Chairman for Finance Com-

mittee which questionably fast-tracked the Agyapa deal, despite the scandalous discovery afterwards, which pointed to the fact that Ghana will significantly loss out in the deal to some faceless private partners domiciled in a notorious tax haven-Jersey.

This is another major investigation attempted by the SPO that is becoming apparent that he will have an uphill task to navigate interference from government appointees, who may have some vested interest in the deal being cleared.

Earlier, Martin Amidu had attempted to investigate serious evidence of illegal mining cartel within the Jubilee House, however, the Science and Technology Minister, Professor Kwabena Frim-

pong-Boateng and the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) conspired against him to scuttle the investigations.

Mr. Amidu himself made this known as he expressed his frustration at the road-blocks mounted before him, preventing him from exposing serious scandalous dealings with the Akufo Addo administration.

A few days ago, the SPO decided to finally investigate the Agyapa deal, forcing the Akufo Addo government to suspend the planned listing of the transaction on the London Stock Exchange (LSE).

A letter from the Finance Ministry to the Special Prosecutor, Martin Amidu, communicated the abortion.

"Kindly note that this Ministry does not intend to proceed with the IPO ahead of the results of the corruption risk assessment by your Office as you may well be aware," a letter from the Finance Ministry read.

It did not communicate a new date for listing Agyapa, which has been perceived as a corrupt deal by many Ghanaians, after it became apparent that the champions of the deal: Finance Minister Ken Ofori-Atta and Gabby Asare Otchere-Darko are the President's close relatives and that they may have been using their influence to personally benefit from the deal.

The deal entails the Akufo-Addo government

converting Ghana's mining royalties received by the Minerals Income fund into a special purpose vehicle to borrow US\$1 billion, using the royalties as collateral for 15 years.

Civil society organisations (CSOs) believe that the deal is aimed to put control of Ghana's minerals royalties into the hands of the "Akyem Sakawa Mafia", made up the President's family, Akyem tribesmen and a few friends.

The deal has been protested by many Ghanaians, especially CSOs who have said that they have been stonewalled by the government after they requested for documents covering the deal.

Special Prosecutor, Martin Amidu, eventually launched a corruption assessment risk demanding documents covering the deal, but the Finance Ministry headed by the President's cousin, Ken Ofori-Atta, refused to hand over all the appropriate documents covering the deal.

The SP insisted on getting all the necessary documents, along with an opinion from the Attorney General, before the initial Public Offering of Agyapa on the LSE would be allowed to go through. The SPO's stance meant that the government's obscurantism ended up eating away the window of time available for the listing which was scheduled for September.



AKUFO ADDO ORDERS PAYMENT OF US\$45,000 GOV'T DEBT TO D.K POISON



President Akufo-Addo has directed the Minister of Sports, Isaac Asiamah, to pay-back US\$45,000 that Ghana's first-ever boxing world champion, David Kotei, loaned to the country in 1976.

In a letter dated September 28, 2020, signed by the Executive Secretary to the President, Nana Bediatuo Asante, President Akufo-Addo has direct-

ed that the money be paid to the man who is popularly known as D.K. Poison. The President claims his order was on "compassionate grounds," for a veteran boxer who has been virtually rendered penniless by the refusal of all successive government to settle their debt to the boxer.

"With reference your letter ... dated 17th June, 2020, I write to convey the

approval of the President of the Republic for an amount of Forty-Five Thousand United States Dollars (US\$45,000.00) to be paid to Mr David Kotei (a.k.a. D.K. Poison) on compassionate grounds.

"By a copy of this letter, the Ministry of Finance is requested to take the necessary action to give effect to this directive. Please accept the President's

best wishes," the letter read.

D.K. Poison, now 69, became Ghana's first boxing world champion when he defeated then Champion, Reuben Oliveres by split points in a 15 round bout in Inglewood, California, USA.

In 1976, he loaned US\$45,000 out of his US\$75,000 winning to the Ignatius Kutu Acheampong government.

And for Forty-four years the loan remained unpaid by successive governments.

Last year October, he met President Akufo-Addo and reiterated his appeal for his money. The President promised to see to it that the issue is settled. Hence the 28th September 2020 directive.

However, the US\$45,000 of 1976 could be anything in the region of over US\$ 1 million if inflation is taken into account.



PRESIDENT COMMISSIONS SOLAR PLANT IN UPPER EAST



President Akufo Addo will on Saturday, October 10, 2020, commission the massive solar plant in Lawra in the Upper West Region.

This will perhaps be the only major power plant the government has completed four years in office.

The plant which is set to diversify the electricity mix particularly in the northern part of the country, is one of two major

solar plants in the region. The other one is in the Kaleo.

The projects appear to have been fast-tracked because President Akufo Addo only cut the sod for them in February this year.

The milestone project consist of a total capacity of 17 Megawatts, with 13MW in Kaleo and a 4MW peak project in Lawra.

The plants will collectively reduce 7,400

tons of carbon dioxide emissions every year upon completion, the project managers have claimed.

They were financed by the German Government's Development Bank, KfW, with a total funding cost of US \$25m.

The project kick-starts the government's plan for renewable energy.

As part of the renewable energy targets, the government has set targets

for some 300 MW of small and medium hydro dams, 30,000 solar home systems, 26 MW of utility-scale biomass and waste energy capacity, 250 MW of utility-scale wind and 150 MW of utility-scale solar capacity.

This will add up to the existing capacity for power in Ghana, which relies heavily on expensive thermal plants.

These plants are likely to add some laurels to the governing New Patriotic Party (NPP) which has mostly been criticized for sleeping on the job and failing considerably to undertake any major infrastructure project in its four-year tenure.

The few that were exhibited by the government were found to be full of deceit and appropriation of projects executed by the erstwhile National Democratic Congress (NDC).




MFANTSIMAN NPP VICE CHAIR BUSTED SELLING SUBSIDIZED OUTBOARD MOTORS

The ruling New Patriotic Party (NPP)'s Vice Chairman for Mfantseman in the Central Region, David Awotwe has been exposed as a member of an NPP cartel which commandeers subsidized outboard motors targeted at fishermen and sell them at almost two times the price.

The cartel, which includes the NPP's Constituency Women's Organizer for Mfantseman, enrich themselves by creaming off thousands of cedis after inflating the price of the subsidized outboard motors.

Award winning investigative journalist, Manasseh Azure Awuni, who investigated the exploitative black market, reports that after he and his team paid Mr. Awotwe Ghc16,000 for the outboard motor that government sold to the fishermen at Ghc10,000, Mr. Awotwe signed on an NPP Campaign flier labelled "4More To Do More," as receipt to cover the criminal sale.

WhatsUp News has seen the NPP campaign flier turned receipt and on it David Awotwe's signature is inked under sales wording that showed that he received Ghc16,000 from Victor Forson, Manasseh's team member, for the outboard motor that the government had given out at Ghc10,000.



The NPP campaign flier turned "chobo" receipt has since been garnering scorn on social media with some commentators inventing puns of the "4More To Do More" heading of the receipt. "It's actually 4 More To Steal More," went one commentary on Facebook.

Manasseh Azure Awuni, is said to have received complaints from the Mfantseman Constituency that the outboard motors that government gives out at a subsidized price of Ghc10,000 instead of the Ghc20,000, market price, never really reach fishermen at that price.

The reason being that the NPP Executives in the Coastal communities, including the Mfantseman Municipality, have formed themselves into cartels which receive the canoes and sell them to the fish-

ermen as middlemen in a black market operation.

Due to the corruption, the fishermen are unable to buy the outboard motors, defeating the purpose of the subsidy.

Mr. Azure, upon hearing the complaint, assembled a team and went off to investigate.

The team is said to have gotten contacts at Apam, Moree, and Biriwa in the Central Region and one in the Western Region, who had the government's subsidised outboard motors to sell above the subsidised price.

At Biriwa in the Mfantseman Municipality, the undercover team was led straight to the NPP constituency women's organiser who was said to have some machines for sale.

Even though the story does not give her name, she

is quoted as arguing that there was nothing wrong with the criminal business she and the NPP cartels are engaged in and that that is one way to benefit from her membership in the party.

"If I already have one on my canoe and they give me an additional one, what am I supposed to do? I have to sell it and take the commission," she is quoted as saying.

She is said to have added that, "Nobody follows a government and would go empty hands. There is a reason we do politics, the benefit."


However, she did not have any outboard motors to sell to the undercover team at that material time, apparently because she had cleared whatever motors were given to her. She however eagerly directed the team to the NPP Constituency Vice Chairman for Mfantseman, David Awotwe, as a man who still has outboard motors to sell. The team followed a middleman.

The middleman led the undercover team to Mr Awotwe's house in Biriwa to see the outboard motor. After they had inspected the product, Mr. Awotwe, led them to an uncompleted building to haggle the price.

Central Regional Minister, Kwamena Duncan is said to have since called for the arrest of the NPP Constituency Vice-Chair.



COCOBOD CEO ANNOUNCES AUDIT REPORT ON COCOA ROADS CANNOT BE MADE AVAILABLE



Suspicion that the Akufo-Addo government did not carry out an audit on the cocoa roads contracts after suspending the contracts in 2017 has thickened after the Chief Executive of the Ghana Cocoa Board (COCOBOD) declared that the audit report is now a national secret.

According to Joseph Boahene Aidoo, the supposed audit report cannot be made available.

He declared the fatwa on Accra based Joy FM.

Shockingly, Mr. Joseph Boahene Aidoo said that for anybody to get a copy of the report they must

go through a rigorous process. The last time the MP for Ashiaman demanded information from the Electoral Commission, even under the Right To Information Law, he was turned away.

The government's stonewalling tactics around the cocoa roads audit report is only nourishing suspicion that the audit was never carried out and that the government had stopped the contract and created the need for audit as a cover story to steal public funds.

It has been emerging that the Chairman of the

ad-hoc audit committee that was formed to do the cocoa roads audit, Alhaji Aminu Amadu, awarded himself the same audit contract. His company, Nyagsi Engineers, was what got the audit contract.

According to allegations, the audit of the cocoa roads cost the taxpayer a whopping US\$-10million.

The 2020 Presidential Candidate of the National Democratic Congress (NDC), former President John Mahama, over the weekend, accused the Akufo-Addo government of lying about auditing

the road contracts, saying no such audit happened.

According to him, the suspension of the contracts to pave roads for cocoa growing communities was purely political and that if the Akufo-Addo government says what he is saying is a lie, it should publish the audit report and show by the report how the previous Mahama government had been corrupt in awarding the contracts as the government has claimed.

In the response, the NPP held a kneejerk press conference at which the party's Director of Communications, Buabeng Asamoah, claimed that nobody had said the Mahama government had been corrupt in awarding the contracts.

Rather, he claimed that the government had awarded the contracts without making provisions for funding, even though the Mahama government had structured the project in such a way that COCOBOD will dedicate US\$150million annually to the construction of cocoa roads.



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GENDER MINISTER'S CAMPAIGN CAR IN HIT-AND-RUN

-Victim Dies

A campaign car said to belong to the Minister for Gender, Children and Social Protection, Cynthia Mamele Morrison knocked down and killed a trader at Babianiha, near Agona Sweduro in the Central Region.

The car's driver, one Ato, said to be the personal bodyguard of the Minister, took to his heels and absconded after the accident. The Police are currently on a



manhunt for him, Whatsup News gathered.

The Toyota Corolla with registration number GN-2537-16 was re-

portedly over-speeding during a campaign float for the Gender Minister who is also the MP for Agona West.

Ato, the speed-monster bodyguard of the Minister who was driving was flagged several times to slow down but he did not; until he hit Nana Yaa, the hapless trader, reports eyewitnesses.

The trader, said to be in her late 30s, was rushed to the Agona Swedru government hospital but was pronounced dead on arrival. Her body has since been deposited at the hospital's morgue, awaiting autopsy.

She left behind six children.



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GENERAL MOSQUITO FILES MAHAMA'S NOMINATION FORMS

-As Mahama launches Sefwi Campaign.



The 2020 Presidential Candidate of the National Democratic Congress, John Dramani Mahama will have his nomination forms for the Presi-

dential election, filed tomorrow.

Party General Secretary, Johnson Asiedu Nketia, alias General Mosquito, will do the filing at the Electoral Commission's

Meanwhile, Mahama will officially launch his national campaign in Sefwi Wiawso in the Western North Region tomor-

row.

The launch on the 7th of October will be broadcast live across the country and will be dubbed "the Retail Campaign".

According to NDC communication, the former President will deliver a nationwide address in which he will call on all party members, especially, executives across the country to hit the ground with the NDC's Peoples Manifesto and explain it out to voters.

WhatsUp News has heard that the 2020 Campaign is mostly going to be house-to-house focused and will entail party loyalists meeting voters on a personal level to sell the NDC's message.

The campaign launch starts at 11 am on Wednesday, according to available information.
